INTERIM ORDER

The Commission heard the Crest (Petitioner) and the Electricity Department, Chandigarh (Respondent) at length.

The Petitioner has submitted that recently in a meeting with the Respondent issues raised by them have been addressed. Further the Respondent has agreed to the new business model/proposal submitted by the Petitioner to the Commission for its approval.

The Respondent has submitted that the said business model/proposal has been examined and agreed by them. The Respondent has further submitted that he has also agreed to all terms and conditions in Quadripartite Agreement (QPA) except a provision relating to banking of power in the said QPA. The Petitioner and the Respondent have also submitted that after resolving the issue of banking of power, they will submit initialized QPA to the Commission for its consideration within a week.

In view of the above, the Commission grants liberty to the Petitioner to file the initialized QPA within a week's time for its consideration.
